

Yielding Right of Way

Most drivers recognize the familiar inverted red and white Yield signs that mean they should slow down, search and enter only if the way is clear of pedestrians, bicyclists and vehicles. But many motorists do not realize that they must also yield when coming off of a ramp and on to a “main” road. Most drivers yield when entering an Interstate highway as they recognize that while there is no “yield” sign, the vehicles traveling the Interstate have the right of way. The same is true when exiting an Interstate on to a main road. Exiting vehicles must yield to vehicles on the main highway.
