Vermont DMV is in the process of creating a web based tutorial. This free interactive program is being designed to help new driver's learn to drive safely. It will also help users get ready to take the written test and will tell them other information about getting a Vermont learner permit or license and driving in Vermont.

This web-based learning tool will include fully interactive and engaging modules that will allow the user to learn by "seeing", "hearing," and also by "doing". There will be a series of interactions such as drag and drop assessments, multiple choice questions and true & false questions, to ensure a fully interactive and engaging experience.

Correctly answering all of the questions in the tutorial is not a guarantee the user will pass the Vermont Learner Permit knowledge test. While the interactive study guide does cover all the information on the Vermont learner permit test, the actual test questions will be different.

Licenses

If you **live in Vermont** and plan to drive in Vermont, you must obtain a Vermont driver's license. A person who has moved into the state from another jurisdiction with a valid license from that state shall obtain a VT license within 60 days of moving into the state.

In accordance with state and federal law, any person holding a commercial driver license from another state must **transfer their commercial driver license** within 30 days of establishing residency in Vermont.

The act of licensing makes driving a privilege, and holding a license requires that you drive within the limits of the law and also treat all users of the highway, including bicyclists, motorcyclists, and pedestrians with courtesy and consideration.
