## **Driver Information:**

- You should see red and blue flashing lights and may hear a siren. The officer may use a loudspeaker to communicate. The officer may shine a flashlight into your car.
- Open your window, put your hands on the steering wheel, and tell the officer, "I have a blue envelope with my information in it."
- Leave your hands on the steering wheel while answering the officer's questions.
- When the officer tells you to, slowly grab the blue envelope and hand it to the officer. Then, return your hands to the steering wheel.
- The officer will go back to their vehicle. You will wait for the officer until they come back. Keep your hands on the steering wheel.
- The officer will explain the end of the stop and tell you when to leave. They will return the Blue Envelope and its contents to you.

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### **Law Enforcement Officer:**

- The driver of this vehicle is on the autism spectrum.
- Autistic people may show emotions differently. If they appear upset or frustrated, it does not mean they intend to be aggressive towards you.
- Individuals may display repetitive body movement or fidgeting and may not make eye contact.
- Individuals may exhibit signs of high anxiety. Bright lights and loud sounds can be overwhelming for autistic people.
- Allow individuals extra time to respond; they may need more time to process your question and formulate their response.
- Speak clearly and limit unnecessary details or jargon.
- If an individual appears to be struggling, ask or consider contacting the support person listed on the envelope.
