




General	<p>An EDL is a Real ID Compliant License that is also a convenient border crossing document for U.S. citizens returning home from Canada, Mexico, the Caribbean or Bermuda, by land or sea. Must be Vermont resident and U.S. Citizen.</p> <p>An EDL is Real ID Compliant</p>	<p>Real ID, in general terms, refers to federal legislation intended to deter terrorism by implementing security regulations. Real ID rules establish minimum standards, procedures, and requirements that Vermont must meet if our state-issued Driver's License or ID cards are to be accepted by the Federal government for official purposes.</p>	<p>A Driver Privilege Card (DPC) is to be used solely for driving purposes. A DPC is marked "Not for Federal Identification" and is NOT Real ID compliant.</p>
