


	<i>Enhanced Driver's License or ID (EDL)</i>	<i>Real ID Compliant Driver's License or ID (LIC)</i>	<i>Non-Real ID Compliant Driver's License or ID (DPC)</i>
Notes	An EDL is a Real ID Compliant License that is also a border crossing document for US citizens returning home from Canada, Mexico, the Caribbean, or Bermuda, by land or sea.	The REAL ID Act establishes minimum security standards for license issuance and production and prohibits Federal agencies from accepting for certain purposes driver's licenses and identification cards from states not meeting the Act's minimum standards.	A Driver Privilege Card is a Vermont license or permit that is NOT Real ID compliant. The Driver Privilege Card is available to anyone that is a Vermont Resident. Issuance of the DPC does not require proof of legal presence or US citizenship.

Identity and date of birth	Must provide <b>one</b> of the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Valid, unexpired passport,</li> <li>• A certified record of the applicant's birth, marriage, adoption, or divorce, including a translation if necessary</li> <li>• Consular Report of Birth Abroad (CRBA) issued by the U.S. Department of State (Form FS-240, DS-1350, or FS-545)</li> <li>• Valid consular identification document issued by the government of Mexico, Guatemala (or any other government with comparable security standards and protocols, as determined by the Commissioner)</li> <li>• Valid, unexpired Permanent Resident Card (Form I-551)</li> <li>• Certificate of Naturalization issued by DHS (Form N-550 or Form N-570)</li> <li>• Certificate of Citizenship (Form N-560 or Form N-561) issued by DHS</li> <li>• Real ID Driver's License or Identification Card issued in compliance with the standards established by <a href="#">6 CFR part 37</a>.</li> </ul>

Social Security Information	<p>You must present your Social Security card or a letter from the Social Security Administration indicating your ineligibility to receive a Social Security number (SSN).</p> <p>If your Social Security card is not available, one of the following forms may be used in its place: W-2 form, SSA-1099 form, pay stub showing name and SSN (minimum of last 4 digits) (Your name must verify with the Social Security Administration). If there have been multiple changes to your name, you must provide documentation to prove the continuity of the names. For example, marriage or civil union certificate (a certified copy issued by town/city), marriage or civil union dissolution, or probate court name change document.)</p>		
Vermont residency and current residential address	<p>You must present <b>two</b> documents that include your name and current Vermont residential address that demonstrate residency in the state of Vermont. Examples include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• piece of mail with current name and Vermont street address including city/town (no PO Boxes),</li> <li>• utility bill (must list service address),</li> <li>• property tax bill with a physical location,</li> <li>• signed lease,</li> <li>• Homeowners/renters insurance (policy/proof of claim),</li> <li>• Vermont EBT or Vermont AIM identification card,</li> <li>• Vermont Residency Certification.</li> </ul>

Lawful status in the United States? <sup>1</sup>	Required	Required	Not Required

<sup>1</sup> In most cases, the documents required for proof of identity and date of birth will also establish lawful status in the United States. Foreign nationals must provide a passport and visa, alien registration receipt card (green card), or other proof of legal presence for inspection and copying.
