Voter Registration You will be registered to vote unless you decline to register below. By signing and submitting this application, you are authorizing the Department of Motor Vehicles to transmit this application to the Secretary of State for voter registration purposes. YOU MAY DECLINE TO REGISTER. Both the office through which you submit this application and your decision of whether or not to register will remain confidential and will be used for voter registration purposes only. In order to be registered to vote, you must: **1)** be a U.S. citizen; **2)** be a resident of Vermont; **3)** have taken the voter's oath; and **4)** 18 years of age or older.

Any person meeting the requirements of 1 - 3 who will be 18 years of age on or before the date of a general election may register and vote in the primary election immediately preceding that general election. Failure to decline to register is an attestation that you meet the requirements to vote.

If you are voting for the first time in Vermont you must take the VOTER'S OATH: **You solemnly swear (or affirm) that whenever you give your vote or suffrage, touching any matter that concerns the State of Vermont, you will do it so as in your conscience you shall judge will most conduce to the best good of the same, as established by the Constitution without fear or favor of any person.**

By signing below you can attest for yourself that you have taken the Oath. You can also have anyone over 18 attest that you have taken the oath.

ADDRESS CHANGE

Address change with no new license printed is free. Submit address change online at dmvexpress.vermont.gov

- If the address given differs from what appears on our records, this will be considered a notification of change of address for all your records. You are required to notify DMV within 30 days of any change in your mailing address, legal name or physical residence.
- Physical address will appear on your license.
- If date of birth given differs from what appears on our records, identification documentation as listed in section 4 is required.
- If place of birth given differs from what appears on our records, a copy of your birth certificate is required.
- Name changes must be processed in person.
 - Individual name change requires an original or certified copy of a marriage license/certificate or court order clearly stating the new name.
 - Company name change requires a change of name certification from the office of Secretary of State.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED

Regardless of whether you are a new applicant or current card holder, you must bring the same types of documents. New applicants and current Driver's License and ID card holders must present the required documents from each of these four categories.

1. **Identity and date of birth** (If undocumented see dmv.vermont.gov for ID requirements)

Must provide one of the following:

- Valid, unexpired U.S. passport, certified copy of a birth certificate filed with the State Office of Vital Statistics or equivalent agency in the individual's state of birth (Birth Certificates issued by a hospital are NOT accepted)
- Consular Report of Birth Abroad (CRBA) issued by the U.S. Department of State (Form FS-240, DS-1350 or FS-545)
- Valid, unexpired Permanent Resident Card (Form I-551)
- Certificate of Naturalization issued by DHS (Form N-550 or Form N-570)
- Certificate of Citizenship (Form N-560 or Form N-561) issued by DHS
- Driver's license/identification card issued in compliance with the standards established by Real ID (cannot be expired more than one year).

2. **Lawful status in the United States**

The documents required for proof of identity and date of birth will also establish lawful status in the United States in most cases, provided the Vermont DMV is able to authenticate and verify the documents under existing and available verification systems. Foreign nationals must provide a passport and visa, alien registration receipt card (green card), or other proof of legal presence for inspection and copying.

3. **Social Security number**

Present your Social Security card. If your Social Security card is not available one of the following forms may be used in its place: W-2 form, SSA-1099 form, pay stub showing name and SSN (minimum of last 4) or a letter from the Social Security Administration indicating ineligibility to receive a Social Security number. (The disclosure of your social security or federal identification number is mandatory, is solicited by the authority granted by 42 U.S.C. §405(c)(2)(C) and/or 666(a)(13) and will be used by the Department of Motor Vehicles in the administration of motor vehicle, tax and child support laws, to identify individuals affected by such laws.)

4. **Vermont residency and current residential address** (If undocumented see dmv.vermont.gov for Residency requirements)

You must present **two** documents that include your name and current Vermont residential address that demonstrate residency in the state of Vermont. Examples: piece of mail with current name and Vermont street address including city/town (no P.O. Boxes), utility bill (must list service address), property tax bill with physical location, signed lease, Homeowners/renters insurance (policy/proof of claim), Vermont EBT or Vermont AIM identification card.

NOTE: Your name must verify with Social Security Administration (SSA). If there have been multiple changes to your name, you must provide documentation to prove the continuity of the names. For example: marriage or civil union certificate (certified copy issued by town/city), marriage or civil union dissolution or probate court name change document.

VETERAN'S INDICATOR ON VERMONT LICENSE/ID

All Vermont residents who are veterans of the U.S. Armed Forces and are currently enlisted or were honorably discharged can choose to have a Veteran's Indicator on their Driver's License, Learner's Permit or Non-Driver ID card. There is no additional fee for the Veteran's Indicator, but all regular transaction fees will apply. **Vermont Certificate of Veteran Status must be completed and approved to show proof of veteran status and submitted with the license, permit or non-driver ID application.**

REGISTER TO VOTE

If you are eligible, today you will be registered to vote unless you decline. You are eligible to vote in the town or city where you physically reside if as of Election Day, you: 1) are a United States citizen 2) are a resident of Vermont 3) are 18 years old 4) take Voter's Oath.

You are a "resident" under Vermont law if you are domiciled in the town as evidenced by intent to maintain a principal dwelling place in the town indefinitely and to return there if temporarily absent, coupled with an act or acts consistent with that intent.

You only need to take the Voter's Oath once. If you were previously registered to vote in Vermont you have already taken the Voter's Oath. You can attest that you have taken the voter's oath for yourself or a DMV employee can administer the Voter's Oath to you.

You are not officially registered to vote until your Town or City Clerk reviews your application to be sure that you meet all eligibility requirements. The Clerk will notify you in writing if your application is approved and notify you of the location of your polling place. If your application is denied, the Clerk will notify you explaining why you are not eligible and also explain how you can file an appeal to the Board of Civil Authority in your Town or City.
