MANDATORY "GOOD STANDING" DECLARATION STATEMENTS

You are required to complete this section even if you do not have children and/or do not pay child support, do not owe taxes to the State of Vermont, or were never subject to any fines or fees.

Child Support (15 V.S.A. Section 795)

A license may not be issued or renewed unless the applicant certifies that he or she is not under an obligation to pay child support or is in good standing with respect to or in full compliance with a plan to pay any and all child support payable under a support order as of the date the application is filed. A "license" is any license, certification, or registration issued by an agency to conduct a trade or business, including a license to practice a profession or occupation. "Good standing" means that less than one-twelfth of the annual support obligation is overdue; or liability for any support payable is being contested in a judicial or quasi-judicial proceeding; or the applicant is in compliance with a repayment plan approved by the office of child support or agreed to by the parties. The licensing agency may also find that requiring immediate payment of child support due and payable would impose an unreasonable hardship. Tax Liability (32 V.S.A. Section 3113)

No agency of the state shall grant, issue or renew any license or other authority to conduct a trade or business (including a license to practice a profession) to, or enter into, extend or renew any contract for the provision of goods, services or real estate space with, any person unless such person shall first sign a written declaration under the pains and penalties of perjury, that the person is in good standing with respect to or in full compliance with a plan to pay, any and all taxes due as of the date such declaration is made. "Good standing" means that no taxes are due and payable; or the liability for any taxes due and payable is on appeal; or the person is in compliance with a payment plan approved by the Commissioner of Taxes. The licensing agency may condition license renewal on terms which would place the applicant in good standing with respect to any and all taxes as soon as reasonably possible, if the agency finds an unreasonable hardship. District Court Fines / Judicial Bureau (4 V.S.A Section 1110)

Every applicant for a license shall sign a statement that the applicant is in good standing with respect to any unpaid judgment issued by the judicial bureau or criminal division of the superior court for fines or penalties for a violation or criminal offense. A license may not be issued or renewed without such a statement.

A person is in good standing with respect to any unpaid judgment issued by the judicial bureau or criminal division of the superior court for fines or penalties for a violation or criminal offense if:

- 1. 60 days or fewer have elapsed since the date a judgment was issued; or
- 2. the person is in compliance with a repayment plan approved by the judiciary
